

RESOLUTION _____

DESIGNATE _____ POLICE DEPARTMENT
AS A WIRELESS 9-1-1 PSAP

WHEREAS the location of any person calling for assistance using a wireless phone is vital information, and

WHEREAS wireless telephone providers will be capable of providing this information to properly equipped safety answering points (PSAPs), and

WHEREAS the state has adopted legislation providing for a primary 9-1-1 PSAP in each county, as well as secondary PSAPs in each county to receive the wireless 9-1-1 calls, and

WHEREAS the _____ Police Department has secured (or is prepared to secure) such equipment and will be fully capable of receiving wireless calls and calculating the caller's actual location

WHEREAS Section 146.70(3m)(c)(1e) Wisconsin Statutes permits the applicant to request reimbursement for the cost of relaying messages regarding wireless emergency 9-1-1 calls via data communications from wireless public safety answering points to a second emergency call center in operation before June 1, 2003, that dispatches the appropriate emergency service providers.

WHEREAS Section 146.70(3m)(d)(4m) Wisconsin Statutes requires that, prior to approving a request for reimbursement of costs related to relay of messages between communications centers within the county, the Public Service Commission must first determine that the reimbursement of such costs are within the public interest and promote health and safety.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the _____ Common Council (Village Board) that the _____ Police Department be designated as a Wireless 9-1-1 PSAP within _____ County in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the _____ Common Council has determined that this establishment and designation of the _____ Police Department as a wireless 9-1-1 PSAP within _____ County is in the public interest and does promote health and safety for our community.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the _____ Police Department is authorized to apply for and accept grants covering costs associated with providing wireless 9-1-1 services as may be authorized and permitted by the Public Service Commission regulations.
