WHAT TO EXPECT...IMPACTS OF MEDICAL/RECREATIONAL MARIJUANA



Ed Shemelya National Marijuana Initiative National Coordinator



Ed Shemelya has been the National Coordinator for the National Marijuana Initiative (NMI) past six years. The NMI strives to dispel misconceptions about marijuana and raise awareness of issues surrounding the drug, so that citizens and policymakers can make well-informed choices regarding marijuana use and regulations.

At its core, the NMI exists to support the 33 HIDTAs as they work to carry out the National Drug Control Strategy. The NMI does this by providing information to law enforcement, policymaker, prevention coalitions, and other community groups concerning marijuana and the impacts of changing policies on marijuana. Ultimately, the NMI works to assist people in making informed choices about marijuana by providing them with valid information.

Ed Shemelya is a 30-year veteran of the Kentucky State Police. Prior to his current assignment, he served as the Eastern Region Marijuana Coordinator for the Appalachia HIDTA, and was responsible for the oversight of marijuana cultivation activities within the four state Appalachia HIDTA region. In 2003, he was appointed Commander of the Kentucky Governor's Marijuana Strike Force and the Kentucky Eradication Initiative, within the AHIDTA.

This multi-agency task force comprised of Federal, State and Local agencies is tasked with fighting Kentucky's outdoor and indoor marijuana problem. During his six years as commander the Kentucky Eradication Task Force was recognized as the most outstanding eradication Task Force in the nation for four consecutive years by the Office of National Drug Control Policy.

FORENSIC EVIDENCE/ICAC/ HUMAN TRAFFICKING UPDATES

Matt is a bureau director at the WI Department of Justice's Division of Criminal Investigation where he works with the Digital Forensics Unit, Internet Crimes Against Children task force, and Human Trafficking Unit.

In his role, Matt helps shape budget and policy; manages recruitments; an collaborates with bureau teams on investigative issues, program management, and public outreach initiatives. Matt has been with the Wisconsin DOJ for 20 years and resides in the Appleton, WI area.



Mr. Bruce served in the elite Navy SEAL Teams for more than 7 years in multiple leadership positions prior to and during the Global War on Terror - Operating in both the Pacific and Middle East theaters.

Clint is sought after as a speaker and thought-leader on Leadership, Counter-Terrorism, and Economic Risks in the Global War on Terror age.



WI STATE PATROL UPDATES & RESOURCES



Anthony Burrell Superintendent Wisconsin State Patrol



This presentation being provided by Supt. Anthony Burrell of the Wisconsin State Patrol (WSP) will provide an overview of the resources and capabilities available to our public safety partners in response to public safety challenges, incidents and events that may be encountered.

Anthony Burrell was appointed by Governor Tony Evers as the Superintendent of the WSP effective January 20, 2019. Burrell began his career as a trooper in St. Croix Co. in 1990. He was promoted to sergeant in 2006, lieutenant in 2012, and named captain of the State Patrol's 11-county Northeast Region in 2015.

Following the tragic shooting death of Trooper Trevor Casper by an armed suspect on March 24, 2015, Burrell was awarded the Medal of Valor - the State Patrol's highest decoration for bravery. In 2016, Burrell was promoted to major and deputy director of the State Patrol's Bureau of Field Operations.

Formerly president of the National Black State Troopers Coalition, Burrell has a bachelor's degree in Finance and a minor in Management from Upper Iowa University. He is also a graduate of the Northwestern University Center for Public Safety.

WI LAW ENFORCEMENT DEATH RESPONSE (LEDR) TEAM UPDATES & INFORMATION



Chief Todd Thomas Coordinator WI LEDR Team



This presentation is being provided by Chief Todd Thomas coordinator of the WI Law Enforcement Death Response (LEDR) Team to provide important updates. WI LEDR was established in 1999 to assist agencies suffering from any kind of police death, whether in the line of duty, suicide, or off-duty. Dealing with these deaths in the close-knit police community goes far beyond extending sympathies and helping to arrange a funeral service.

Prior to becoming the Chief of Police at the Appleton Police Dept. in 2015, Todd served as Captain of the Investigations Division of the Green Bay Police Dept. He also served as a Unified Tactical Instructor for 10 years at several technical colleges.

Chief Thomas has been the coordinator of the WI LEDR Team since January of 2015 and has unfortunately had to assist agencies across the state with 27 Line of Duty Deaths or Suicides.

Todd earned a Bachelor of Arts from Concordia University in Criminal Justice. Additionally, he is a graduate of the 225th Session of the FBI National Academy and the Executive Development Institute. He has been awarded Green Bay Police Department's Officer of the Year, three Distinguished Service Medals with Valor, and a Governor's commendation for his volunteer work with the Special Olympics.

THE WI DEPT. OF TRANSPORTATION'S TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT CENTER (TMC) & TRAFFIC INCIDENT MANAGEMENT ENHANCEMENT (TIME) PROGRAMS



Lt. Nate Clarke WI State Patrol TMC Executive Officer





David Spakowicz WI DOT TIME Program Manager

This presentation is being provided David Spakowicz and Lt. Nate Clarke. Lt. Clarke will explain how the WI Dept. of Transportation's Traffic Management Center (TMC) can assist your agency in the mitigation of not only traffic incidents, but with other types of incidents as well. The Wisconsin State Patrol (WSP) has staff on duty that is responsible to assist your agency with any number of assets you may need. From additional troopers to a K-9, from air assets to the Technical Reconstruction Unit (TRU). It can all be coordinated through the TMC. The TMC monitors the 450+ traffic cameras, the 165 Dynamic Message Boards and the 160+ Portable Changeable Message Boards currently in operation throughout the state. All of which are available to assist your agency in the mitigation or support of an incident. The TMC is also currently dispatching WSP staff for three of its five regional offices throughout the state.

Lt. Nate Clarke currently serves as the Executive Officer for the TMC of the WSP. In 1996, he graduated from the WSP Academy and begin his career with the WSP, serving for 9 years as an Interstate Trooper in Racine Co. In 2005, Lt. Clarke accepted a promotion to the rank of Sgt. in Waukesha Co. He later served 4 years at the WIHIDTA, supervising the Interdiction Initiative, before being promoted to the rank of Lt. in November of 2015.

David Spakowicz will explain the Traffic Incident Management Enhancement (TIME) program which is a training-based program designed to improve the safety of not only law enforcement officers throughout the state, but the safety of all responders that work in or around live traffic. Since 2016, this program has been part of the 720-hours of required training detailed within Wisconsin's Law Enforcement Preparatory Training Curriculum. Through the application of simple TIM principles, your officers will enhance their safety when involved in the mitigation of a traffic incident.

David has 31 years of law enforcement experience in WI. In October of 2013, Dave became the TIME Program Manager for the WI DOT. As program manager, Dave is responsible for coordinating the formal training in traffic incident management for all incident responder disciplines throughout the state. Dave also moderates formal After-Action Reviews of significant traffic incidents. Dave completed the Federal Highway Administration's Traffic Incident Management "Train-the-Trainer" course at the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg, MD and has instructed numerous TIM responder courses throughout Wisconsin.

Christopher DeRemer Special Agent in Charge WI Dept. of Justice Div. of Criminal Investigations

Christopher DeRemer is a Special Agent in Charge (SAC) with the Wisconsin Department of Justice – Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) and Director of the Wisconsin Statewide Intelligence Center (WSIC) located in Madison, Wisconsin. The WSIC is one of two fusion centers in the State of Wisconsin, and serves as a focal point for threat information sharing among federal, state, local and tribal law enforcement; emergency management; fire service; public health; military and private sector partners. SAC DeRemer also supervises the Division of Criminal Investigation's Technical Services Unit and Cyber Investigations Unit.

SAC DeRemer also serves as a member of the Board of Directors of the National Fusion Center Association, which represents the interests of the 79 fusion centers across the country, to enhance public safety and encourage effective intelligence and information sharing. As a member of the NFCA Board of Directors, SAC DeRemer serves as a co-chair of the NFCA's Cyber Threat Information Subcommittee.

Josh Kaul **Attorney General** WI Dept. of Justice Office of the Attorney General

Josh Kaul was sworn in as Wisconsin's 45th Attorney General on January 7, 2019. Josh's top priority is public safety. Josh is also committed to fighting for clean and safe drinking water and against climate change and to protecting the rights of Wisconsinites.

Josh served as a federal prosecutor in Baltimore, where he prosecuted murderers, gang members, and drug traffickers. After moving back home to Wisconsin, he worked to protect our right to vote, going to court to challenge restrictions on voting.

Josh grew up in Oshkosh and Fond du Lac. He went to college at Yale, majoring in history and economics and graduating with honors. He then attended Stanford Law School, where he served as President of the Stanford Law Review.


